Casa de las Conejitas (Bunny House)

Built in 1925, the Playboy Mansion is a Gothic-style home on 5.7 acres. After it was purchased by Playboy in the 1970's, major additions were made to the extant Redwood Forest (60 trees over 70 feet high), front lawn and front circle including the pool and grotto, bathouse and gym, private zoo with exotic birds, primates, aviary - all with permits - and much lush, tropical planting.

REMEMBRANCE OF THINGS PAST Landscape Design by: Christine London

This hillside Wallace Neff house dialogues well with the surrounding landscape and the connection to the garden is notable as trees, vista and light are continually visible. The gardens terrace in a relaxed manner and a diversity of spaces unfold from open lawn and views to secluded shade gardens and water elements.

GREEN WORLD FOR ALL SEASONS

In this garden for roving, pathways loop around the Georgian house along a route from calm geometry to wild woods. The series of scenes combine choruses of framing hedges and lead performers including sequoia forest, medieval olive jar, collections of flowers in vases and pots, rustic seat, and a curved parterre for vegetables.

PARADISE FOUND

Old world Mediterranean plants surround this stunning example of "Googie" architecture nestled in the Hills of Beverly. Citrus in gravel and Australian plants and grasses are planted on the driest slopes and parkway. A pathway of pebble stone carpets leads to the splendid Coral Tree in the view garden.

GOLDEN SUNSET UNDER THE SYCAMORES Landscape Design by: Katherine Spitz Associates, Inc.

From the exuberant magenta and red "lipstick" inspired flower border along the street to the surprising Tiki Garden tucked away to the side, this garden is about lives lived, both playful and profound. Set under a grove of golden Sycamore are bijoux spaces: a quiet seating area; an unexpectedly spectacular popjet fountain, replete with color and sound; a refined and quiet pond, and multiple outdoor dining areas.
